Welcome to Bob Tindel

Bob says he has been taking photographs since he was 12 years old – "Many years ago". He is now retired from law enforcement. He also had a dark room setup at age 14, in his mother's bathroom until she got tired of it.

Bob had been using Nikon equipment, but is currently shooting almost exclusively digital format. His favorite subjects are cars, and family. He also enjoys macro photography, in that with the digital camera, he can focus down to 8/10th of an inch. The depth of field is limited at this close, so subjects need to be fairly flat, like coins or jewelry.

Bob has developed a process for shooting panoramic landscapes, 360 degrees, printing them on 8" x 10" inkjet paper and matting them in a 5 to 6 feet frame. Hopefully he will bring some of these to the next members' night.


