## Behind the camera...that last shot...what did you think at the time you released the shutter?

There is a thread that connects us to the dawn of human existence back through the years to the first person to scratch a few lines of a petroglyph representing their view of the world, the awesome beauty around them and the myriad beasts they shared the Earth with (or perhaps this was merely the original fast food menu).

So many symbols whose meaning we can only guess at, except that to that early man it was important enough to spend a few hours chipping away solid rock to leave a message long after he would be gone.

Why bother? Why do we bother to carry away a little frame of cellulose with a record of light? What can it possibly mean in the context of human history and our own individual rocket-trip life that is over in just a flash?

My feelings bounce back and forth, thinking that I will never be able to fulfill all my interest in this creative endeavor giving the sense often, that I, too, have just scratched the surface and haven't enough years to learn it all and need to hurry up. Then sometimes I feel like packing it all up in a box and sending it to the attic, because I wonder, who is going to care after I'm gone?

The fabric of each day of our lives has that thread woven in the warp and the woof, that same thread that connects us to that first soul pounding on stone. That soul dressed in animal skins (or not), grasping a tool, sweating, intent, muscles cramping, hunkered down to scratch the meaning.

Questions come to me as I meander through a museum or gallery exhibit as I gaze intently, trying to understand what the artist is saying. What does it mean? What does it all mean to me? What makes me think I have anything different or unique to add to this human-wide dialogue that hasn't been said already? Sometimes I get it and sometimes I don't.

This is what I do get:

The thread is this: Together with the petroglyph carver, we walk the earth intimately aware of certain mortality snapping at our heels and peering over our shoulder. And every one of us longs to cry out from the depths of our souls...

"YES!!"

"That's what I'm talking about!"

"Did you see that?! WOW!!"

"Me, me, me, that's right."

"I came. I saw. I ate. I was. I am."

"God, you go!"

"I touched that!"

"Uh-huh, uh-huh, uh-huh."

And we articulate these highly profound affirmations in our art, whatever art we choose.

I can nod my head knowingly while sitting at a railroad crossing watching the boxcars blink by, and nod again when I see "Kilroy was here."

I hear what you're saying.

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
