Tips & Techniques

More Photoshop Techniques

Make smaller movements: Sometimes the cursor moves more than you want when trying to align elements in an image. That's because **Snap To** is enabled. To make movements in smaller increments, turn it off.

1. Select **View**, **Snap** or use the keyboard shortcut of **Shift**, **Control**, ; (MAC= Shift, Command, ;). (This is not a typo: the command is Shift, Control, Semicolon.)

Change bland skies to cloudy skies: Use the cloud filter to improve your skies.

- 1. Set the Background color to a slightly darker blue than the original sky.
- 2. Set the Foreground color to a lighter version than the original sky.
- 3. Select the sky using the **Magic Wand**. If it does not capture the entire sky, hold down Shift and click on the additional portions of the sky until you have it all.
- 4. Select Filter, Render, Clouds.
