

I mages on CDs should be:

- I mage Size: long dimension = 1024 pixels (14.222")
- Resolution: 72 ppi
- File Format: JPEG
- Color Space: sRGB preferred
- Do not include other data on

FOR PRINT DISPLAY

Print images should be:

 I mage Size: long dimension must be at least 10 inches

or

total image must be at least 80 inches square (8x10, 4x20, etc.) whichever is larger.

- Mounted on a firm surface
- I mage mounting surface may be temporary or permanent, oversize or not.




