#### OCTOBER 3<sup>RD</sup> Annual Slide Competition


Get ready for an exciting evening!

#### CONFIGURING IMAGES FOR

#### DIGITAL PROJECTION

I mages on CDs should be:

- I mage Size: long dimension = 1024 pixels (14.222")
- Resolution: 72 ppi
- File Format: JPEG
- Color Space: sRGB preferred
- Do not include other data on the CD.
- File name: 2 digits-first initial last name.JPEG Example: 01-KDoyle.jpeg

#### PRINT DI SPLAY

Print images should be:

• I mage Size (whichever is larger): long dimension must be at least 10 inches or

total image must be at least 80 inches square (8x10, 4x20, etc.)

- Mounted on a firm surface
- Mounting surface may be temporary or permanent, oversize or not.

#### DAN SHOREY


Welcome also to *Dan Shorey*.

### PHOTOSHOP TIPS AND TECHNIQUES

### Keyboard Shortcuts are the "Keys" to Smooth Workflow

Learning keyboard shortcuts can save you lots of time and aggravation. Moving your mouse around to pull down menus and click on words can be a real pain; keystroke combinations are much faster.

You don't have to memorize them all at once. Whenever you begin a new project, take the time to learn one

When you access a command via the pull down menu, the shortcut is listed to the right.

For example, the shortcut for Image, Adjustments, Curves is "Control, M" (MAC = Command, M) and it's just to the right of the word Curves.

Learning them one at a time makes it easy. Soon, you'll be working so quickly, you'll wonder why you ever used

the pull-down menus; and your friends will consider you the Power User!

#### **REMOVE COLOR CASTS**

If you still have a color cast, even after adjusting highlights and shadows,

- 1. add an Adjustment Layer.
- 2. select Solid Color.
- 3. choose a neutral color for the fill (black, white or gray work best).
- 4. set the Blend Mode to Color.
- 5. click on the layer mask and invert it by pressing Control-I (MAC = Command, I).
- 6. gradually adjust the neutral tone by painting with white at a low opacity setting.

This technique can be used for an overall image, or just for areas within the image.


