# CONFIGURING IMAGES FOR DIGITAL PROJECTION

Images on CDs should be:

- Image Size: long dimension = 1024 pixels (14.222")
- Resolution: 72 ppi
- File Format: JPEG
- Color Space: sRGB preferred
- Do not include other data on the CD.
- File name: 2 digits-first initial last name.JPEG

Example: 01-KDoyle.jpeg

**FOR** 

#### PRINT DISPLAY

Print images should be:

• Image Size (whichever is larger): long dimension must be at least 10 inches

or

total image must be at least 80 inches square (8x10, 4x20, etc.)

- Mounted on a firm surface
- Mounting surface may be temporary or permanent, oversize or not.

(S4C) for the next year.


The club has incurred the cost of membership; RCC members will receive this year's benefits at no cost to them.

### IRWIN REEVES


Irwin Reeves s a recent member of RCC. He has been interested in photography most of his life, learning from his parents and later taking some college courses and having his own darkroom.

# PHOTOSHOP TIPS AND TECHNIQUES

Re-sizing an Image

After importing an image into your computer, you're probably going to want to re-size before printing. But you should perform other adjustments, such as *Levels*, *Curves*, *Hue/Saturation*,

*Brightness/Contrast*, etc. first.

Some experts suggest you perform these adjustments, then archive your original size (in .psd format, if using Photoshop). Afterward, you can **Re-size** and **Sharpen** (in that order) this adjusted file for each print size. You can **Save As** each image size separately (i.e. "myfile 5x7.psd or .jpg). Don't re-size an already resized image; that's like making a copy of a copy.

Important points to remember when re-sizing:

- File size affects print size. A 1,000 pixel wide by 1,500 pixel wide image at 300 ppi (about 1.9 kb file size) will fit into a 3.33" x 5" print.
- If you uncheck the RESAMPLE IMAGE box, you can play with Resolution and Width or Height to see their

reciprocal effects. For example, doubling the print size will reduce the *Resolution* by half.


- By changing the Resolution to your desired printer's requirement (typically 240 – 300), the print size automatically
- adjusts; but the *File Size* will not change.
- If you need a larger print size after changing Resolution, you must RESAMPLE the image.

Check the **RESAMPLE IMAGE** box and leave *Bicubic* selected in the larger box. Then go back

to Width or Height and change one of those dimensions. The other dimension will automatically change based on the original Pixel Dimensions settings.

Don't change the print size by more than twice its original dimensions. After clicking **OK**, **SHARPEN** the image, as this resampling process adds pixels by a mathematical formula; it does not enlarge the original pixels.

Re-sizing an image is an easy process, and rightly so; it's something we must do frequently. But it's important not to use the Resample Image feature unless necessary.


