

- **The Bauer Daffodil Gardens** in *Smiley Park* near Running Springs. I'm amazed every time I encounter a local who has never visited this treasure in our nearby mountains. Only a half hour from Redlands up route 30 and 330, off Fredalba Rd. just before Running Springs. ## CONFIGURING IMAGES FOR

#### **DIGITAL PROJECTION**

I mages on CDs should be:

- I mage Size: long dimension = 1024 pixels
- Resolution: 72 ppiFile Format: JPEG
- Color Space: sRGB preferred
- Do not include other data on the CD.
- File name: 2 digits-first initial last name.JPEG

Example: 01-KDoyle.jpeg

## FOR PRINT DISPLAY

Print images should be:

- I mage Size (whichever is larger): long dimension must be at least 10 inches
  - or

total image must be at least 80 inches square (8x10, 4x20, etc.)

- Mounted on a firm surface
- Mounting surface may be temporary or permanent, oversize or not.

## Beanbags

I had a teacher in college who talked about using beanbags in place of a tripod. A beanbag can help balance a camera on uneven surfaces, and in the teacher's case, one helped get the seats next to his on airplanes. His beanbag was a green frog that he'd talk to.





## TIPS AND TECHNIQUES

Gas-Ghosting

Gas-ghosting is a common problem that arises when digital prints are displayed under glass. This happens when the ink and paper don't completely cure before the print is placed under the glass. Glossy papers typically need more curing time than matte or watercolor papers. And the ghosting can occur with *any* manufacturers' ink and paper combinations.

To prevent ghosting, Epson's general guidelines will probably work regardless of the printer, paper, or ink you use:

- 1. Allow the print to rest for about 15 minutes after it comes out of the printer. Don't let anything rest on top of it, including other prints coming out.
- 2. After the initial 15 minutes, place a sheet of plain paper (not photo paper) on top of the print for 24 hours. It will absorb gases and help accelerate any out-gassing.
- 3. After 24 hours, if the plain paper is wavy, repeat Step 2 with a new sheet of paper.

If a current print under glass is exhibiting the gas-ghosting condition:

- 1. Remove it and clean the glass with a good glass cleaner.
- 2. Perform Steps 2 and 3 outlined above.
- 3. Once the print is satisfactory, re-install it under the cleaned and dried glass.
