I hope you all are preparing for the June 16th Annual Print Competition. That means out shooting quality images, selecting the best for printing, and following up with Frank Peele's suggestions in his excellent program last meeting, "Preparing Prints for Competition". As always, Frank displayed his comprehensive knowledge in our field, and gave clear and useful demonstrations for improving our prints. He was a true artist at work.

Speaking of artists, I had an interesting experience the other night. I was acting as Docent at the Art Show portion of the *National Orange Show* in San Bernardino. I was lucky enough to have one of my photo entries accepted into the show. Reviewing the show program, I noted that only 11 or the 102 selected pieces were photographs. The rest were a wide range of painting and drawing media and sculpture.

In conversation with a fellow docent, we discussed the role of photography in the art world. It was her opinion that photography is not "real art" or fine art. She thought that it should not generally be included in art shows, and should be segregated (my word) into photo shows only. Needless to say, I was way on the other side of this debate!

She used the example that if 6 painters were all together at some iconic spot such as Yosemite, and they all painted a picture, each would be different, in their own individual styles. If 6 photographers were there, she said, they would all take the same picture. I was quick to explain that, indeed, 6 photographers at the same place, would result in 6 very different images. She wasn't convinced. I was fairly frustrated. We left it there. There was nothing more to say.

This did start me thinking, however, about the wonderful range of images, the true art, that we produce, and how it can stand on it's own in the art world. We should never, ever, consider our art less than any other medium, and by constantly improving our skills, we can put beautiful images out in the world, and be justly proud.


Bessie Reece Field trips in the planning stage are:

but it must be glazed (glass over the picture). Your name, title of the picture, and sale price (if for sale) must be on the back.

There is a \$3.00 fee for each work hung: cash or check. Work left for another hanging will be charged again. Work not retrieved after a new hanging will be charged a \$3.00 storage fee.
