This is an opportunity to bring potential competition images for input prior to the next Digital Competition; or just bring along anything you would like to share.

Remember to properly configure, size and name your CD images; Color Space: sRGB, 1280 pixels on the long side, saved as .JPG, file size no larger than 3,000 Kb (3 Mg).

File names should include: skill category-image category-name-number (example: Intermediate-Places-JSparhawk-1).

The first tutorials demonstrate how to resize and rename your images for competition and Members' Nights, how to create the text file that goes with it, and how to put it all onto the CD.

Also, there are tutorials for how to begin editing your images. The first steps after downloading images from your camera should be adjusting **Levels** and **Curves**. These simple but crucial steps will take about 5 minutes to view and will take your images to new levels (pardon the pun).

There is a \$3.00 fee for each work hung: cash or check. Work left for another hanging will be charged again. Work not retrieved after a new hanging will be charged a

\$3.00 storage fee.
