


### Wayne (Woody) Wood



# THE PRESS-ENTERPRISE **SPOTLIGHT: JOE DIGREGORIO**

t is no surprise that when Joe DiGregorio retired and recently began to pursue his interest in artmaking that he selected an art form photography - that aligned with his career-long work in the field of engineering.

After a successful career as a senior research engineer with a major petroleum company and an engineering administrator at various universities (most recently at UC Riverside), DiGregorio found photography and the camera to be well suited to his natural skills with science and sophisticated instruments of technology.

In the past couple of years since retiring, DiGregorio has been creating High Dynamic Range photographic images that defy the typical approaches and techniques of the mainstream photography world. His series of HDR photographs focus on landscapes, buildings, lakes, rivers, and other scenes in California, Arizona and New Mexico.

Addressing the old debate over the legitimacy of photography as a fine or contemporary art form, DiGregorio states, "Some would argue that photography is not a "creative art," in the same sense as painting or sculpture. Some photographers merous collectors' support regard their photos as pure in a short amount of time.

documentation of the subject ... recording precisely what they see in an entirely objective manner.

"However, photographers like me prefer to have their photographs express their personal and subjective response to the scene or subject. Instead, I am motivated to convey my exact feelings and emotions at the moment of taking the photograph, and that is inherently a very creative act and process."

DiGregorio regards his HDR photographic images as "Modern Impressionism" because they remind many viewers of French Impressionist paintings of the late 19th century. DiGregorio's technique has earned him several art awards and nu-

Pursuing and developing his love of photography has been particularly gratifying during a time in which Di-Gregorio was successfully fighting non-Hodgkins lymphoma. As a cancer survivor, DiGregorio is most proud of the photographic image he created for his fellow cancer survivors during his chemotherapy treatments at the Riverside Medical Center.

"Photography is more than a hobby or diversion," states DiGregorio. "Rather, it has connected my life's interests and skills with the people and places that have the greatest meaning of life to me."
