# APRIL 6TH

## A View of History Past: Bob Fletcher

Our first meeting will be a presentation by professional photographer, Bob Fletcher. He will be presenting *Bodie State Historical Park* from a photographers' point-of-view. His presentation will include a slide show of his many trips to Bodie and the challenges of photographing buildings that are maintained in a "state of arrested decay." He will also address the challenges of working with the *California State Park* system in obtaining permissions and permits for photographing and teaching a photo workshop within the State Park system.

# APRIL 20TH

## Sensor Cleaning and Monitor Calibration: Frank Peele

Frank Peele will cover two vital topics for digital photographers: cleaning the sensor of your digital SLR camera, and color-managed workflow using a monitor calibration tool.

If you've seen a pattern of indistinct darkish spots in your digital images, especially in clear skies and other non-patterned areas, you've probably got dust bunnies on your digital sensor. Sensor cleaning is a subject shrouded in mystery, causing dread in many digital camera owners. But it doesn't have to be. Frank will show how to easily determine if your sensor needs cleaning, and if it does, how to do it safely and effectively. There will be sensor-cleaning kits available for sale at members-only prices, but purchase is not necessary to be able to clean your own sensor (one SLR camera per member please, to allow as many members as possible to participate). Be certain your camera's battery is fully charged, and bring its manual. If possible, replace the lens with a body cap to facilitate the cleaning process.

Working with an un-calibrated monitor means that getting good prints is partly a matter of luck, costing money and time in the process. The club has purchased a ColorMunki calibration tool with licenses for all members to use it on their own computer monitors. This device allows one to easily set up monitors, printers and projectors for a complete color-managed workflow, ensuring that what you see on the monitor matches the prints themselves as closely as possible. This program will introduce the ColorMunki to RCC members and give an overview of its use.

Frank Peele is a Certified Professional Photographer and four-time RCC Past President. He teaches the photography courses for the Redlands Adult School.


