The title of your image will become the file name. For example, if the title of your image is Stormy Weather, then your file name will be stormyweather.jpg.

While punctuation will be appropriate in the title, <u>please don't put any punctuation or spaces in the file name</u>. And do not type ".jpg" in the file name; saving the file as a .jpg will do that automatically.


