Since moving to Joshua Tree, his quest to photograph wildlife and nature has allowed him to assemble an incredible collection of local photographic treasures. McChesney is also a current national harmonica champion and has given 1000's of performances as "Hurricane" David throughout his travels. In 2008, he published the book "Muir Roots: At One with the Wild" and is currently working on a book illustrating Joshua Tree National Park.

McChesney will speak about the numerous techniques, composition and equipment he uses while photographing, with open discussion and will finish with his "Muir Roots" images.

# FIELD TRIPS

Let's get rollin'......for train buffs, or anyone that likes historic "stuff", we will visit the San Bernardino Historic Railway Days On Saturday, May 8th. San Bernardino is celebrating its Bicentennial this year, as the city was founded in 1810. This Historic Railway Days is part of this celebration.

This event will be from 9 - 4 pm at the historic Santa Fe Depot at 1170 West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street in S.B. The Historical Society has restored steam engine 3751, which will pull into the depot after 10am, a potential photo opportunity for a working steam engine. Also, the depot museum will have historic exhibits. A large tent will display old cars, trucks, and model trains. The depot was built in 1918, and was renovated in the last few years. It is a working depot for Amtrak, with interesting architectural details. There will be food, drinks, and music. The event is free, and continues on Sunday, 9am - 4pm.

I will not be able to attend this field trip, as I will be participating in Art in the Park in Redlands that weekend. Since it is close by in S.B., it will be best to meet up about 9am, on location, and search out the photo ops together or independently. I really wish I could be there!

Directions: From I-10 and I-215 interchange, go North, 3.1 miles on I-215; exit at 2<sup>nd</sup> Street/Civic Center, go .2 miles; turn left on W. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, go .4 miles; turn right on North K Street, turn left on West 3<sup>nd</sup> Street. 1170 W. 3<sup>rd</sup> Street is on the right.

Keeping in this theme, a second field trip is planned for Saturday, May 15th to Orange Empire Railway Museum at 2201 South A Street, Perris, CA. The hours are 9 - 5 pm daily. On weekends there are operating trains and trolleys, and on that weekend their steam engine, Ventura County #2, will be operating -- a second chance to see a steam engine in operation. If you have not visited this museum before, it covers a large area, and gives many opportunities for photographing "old stuff", train engines and cars, related equipment, and historic exhibits. Admission is free.

I will not be able to attend this field trip as I will be out of state. Anyone interested in carpooling, may meet at our usual spot -- Coco's in Redlands at 8am. It is 33 miles and takes about 40 minutes, so you should arrive about opening time of 9 am.

Directions: From I-10 and I-215 interchange, go South toward Riverside on I-215, take the San Diego exit onto I-215 S, take the Perris D Street exit onto North D Street, 1.3 miles, turn right on W. 11th Street, 1 mile; turn left on S. A Street, 1 mile; arrive 2201 S. A St. Perris, on left.







