You may use a frameless presentation.

Your name, title of the picture, and sale price (if for sale) must be on the back.

There is a \$3.00 fee for each work hung: cash or check.

Work left for another hanging will be charged again.

Work removed but not retrieved after a new hanging will be charged a \$3.00 storage fee.

Work unclaimed within 60 days of removal will be considered abandoned and become the property of Redlands Camera Club for disposal or sale at its sole discretion.

If you want to take your camera work to a higher level, attend this workshop to explore controlling exposure, depth of field, and movement of camera and subject during image capture. Armed with new knowledge and confidence, you probably won't ever want to use your camera's Automatic mode again.

Photoshop tip: CREATE A BACKGROUND BLUR

Open an image and choose Filter>Convert For Smart Filters, then choose Filter>Blur>Gaussian Blur. Overly blur the image and press OK.

In your Layers panel, activate the Smart Filter mask (white thumbnail) and, using a large soft brush set to black, click once on your focal point.

To reduce the blur, double-click the Blending Options icon to the right of the Gaussian Blur layer and lower the Opacity.


Photoshop tip: Protecting Transparent Pixels

Photoshop also lets you protect transparent areas on a layer. Click the first of the Lock icons (Lock Transparent Pixels) near the top of the Layers panel. This can be especially useful prior to applying a Blur filter. The edges of the layer content will remain sharp while the content itself gets blurred. It's also great for outlining artwork with a soft brush.
