On August 21st, fifteen members of the *Redlands Camera Club* participated in an outstanding field trip to Del Mar Fairgrounds to photograph the Del Mar Horse Racing Live Meet. It was a unique experience as, thanks to the hard work of Sandy Woodcock and the generosity of the Del Mar officials, we had VIP access to the event and the helpful assistance of fairground experts. They educated us on the history of the fairground and traditions of horse racing as well as guiding us to the best locations to photograph the various activities associated

with the races. Our thanks go out to Mac McBride, Director of Media for the *Del Mar Thoroughbred Club* and Jeremy Lyverse, media intern from *Western Kentucky University* for their contribution to the Club's successful activity.

Field trips and other activities sponsored by the club are fantastic opportunities to get to know one another better, share photographic expertise, and to photograph events or places that we individually may not get to experience on our own. Field trips especially offer the opportunity to learn the importance of planning ahead and adequately preparing for a shoot. Of course there's the process of selecting the equipment that we think we might need and ensuring that it's prepped, i.e. batteries charged, memory cards formatted, lenses cleaned, etc. It's also important to ensure that you're prepped too. What type of clothes, shoes, hats, or glasses may be needed? Do you need to take food and water? I always include several bottles of water even to events like Del Mar because it allows me to hydrate whereever I'm at so I don't need to miss a shooting opportunity to look for a water fountain. And remember the sunscreen!

Another important aspect of adequate preparation is research. Google is a wonderful tool to find out background information on where and what you are planning to photograph. Are there other subjects, events, or locations that you can take advantage of? What's the weather going to be and is there any information about the best time of day to be there? Look for photographic tips on how to best capture your planned subjects. Look at other photographer's images to get ideas on what works as well as to learn what would be cliché shots so that you can challenge yourself to do something unique. If your subject is going to require some special skills that are new to you, practice them in advance so that you can learn how to master the skills prior to the event.

Well enough for now. Summers coming to an end, so get out there and get those last summer shots and start preparing for Fall opportunities.

September Field Trip—Tall Ships Festival in Dana Point

Note: This is <u>not</u> the field trip we discussed at the last meeting. We will <u>not</u> have a tall ship of our own to go out on. <u>This</u> is the annual Tall Ships Festival, with many activities to participate in. We may schedule our own ship in the spring. This field trip will give us a taste of the possibilities, with many ships to view, and the opportunity to go out on one of eight ships if we so desire.

This is the 26th Tall Ships Festival in Dana Point. The festival runs from Friday through Sunday. Our trip is planned for Saturday, September 10th. If anyone cannot attend that day, but is interested in the festival, it can be attended independently on Friday evening or Sunday all day.

The festival offers opportunities for on-deck tours on 8 or 9 tall ships, activities aboard the *Brig Pilgrim*, admission to the *Ocean Education Center* activities and exhibits, an arts and crafts show, plus interactive living history encampments, such as blacksmithing, scrimshaw artists and friendly pirates. To participate in the above, we must purchase a **Pirate Adventure Pass**, \$10.00 for adults.

If you wish to sail on one of the ships on the *Cannon Battle Cruise*, late Saturday afternoon, you must make your own reservation. These fill up early, so it is recommended you go on-line to www.tallshipsfestival.com to reserve. The website shows photos of the various available ships, to help make your choices. **Cost of the** *Cannon Battle Cruise* is \$65.00, paid in advance.

Whether you choose to pay only the \$10 and stay on shore, or pay the extra \$65 and go out to sea, there should be plenty of photo opportunities of ships, maritime details, costumed people, sea creatures in the institute, and whatever else we run across.

The festival opens at 10:00 am on Saturday. I suggest getting there by 9:30 at the latest. Parking may be an issue, and an early arrival should help. Dana Point Harbor is about 75 miles from Redlands, and will take about 1.5 hours to drive. Carpoolers should meet at Coco's in Redlands at 7:30 am to leave by 7:45 am.

Directions: Take I-10 West; take the 215 South toward Riverside; merge onto CA-91 West, go 24 miles; merge onto CA-241 South, via exit 41B toward Irvine, go 12.3 miles; merge onto CA-133 South via Exit 27 toward I-5 South, go 3.9 miles; merge onto I-5 South via exit 10A toward San Diego, go 16.5 miles; merge onto CA-1 via exit 79 toward Pacific Coast Highway, go 1.3 miles; turn LEFT onto Dana Point Harbor Drive, go 1.3 miles; 24200 Dana Point Harbor Drive is on the left.

Please be aware that portions of the above drive are toll roads; be prepared to pay a few dollars at different toll booths. There may be a parking charge.

Photography Classes Begin This Fall

The former Redlands Adult School photography classes, canceled in California's education budget crisis, are being updated and reborn through the Redlands Camera Club!

Here are the details:

Basic Photography Once weekly for six weeks, beginning Sept. 20, 2011

This class is designed for those who are relatively new to digital photography, whether you have previous experience shooting film or not. The fundamentals of photography – choosing the best camera for your needs, the technical considerations, understanding light, the principles of composition, an introduction to managing and editing your work in the computer – will all be covered.

Tuition: \$60. Prerequisite: membership in RCC.

<u>Intermediate Photography</u> Twice weekly for six weeks, beginning Nov. 1, 2011

The focus in this class is entirely on improving your creative and technical skills. The class will meet once a week at photogenic areas in Redlands for 3 hours of shooting, and once a week to critique the photographs. The shooting sessions will be scheduled at the best day and evening times for photography; the shooting schedule will be established by mutual agreement of the class members at the first class meeting on November 1. The critiquing sessions will take place on Tuesday evenings, 6 to 9 p.m., in the classroom. To give each student personal attention in shooting and critiques, this class will be strictly limited to 15 students.

Tuition: \$100. Pre-requisites: membership in RCC and Basic Photography or equivalent course work.

<u>Image Editing with Photoshop Elements</u> Once weekly for six weeks, beginning Jan. 3, 2012

Digital photographs offer the potential for enhancements that equal anything that could ever have been done in the traditional wet darkroom – and so much more. Using Adobe Photoshop Elements, you'll learn how to manage your growing collection of digital files and how to realize your own personal vision through the amazing power of image editing. Packed with most of the power of its "bigger brother" Photoshop, Photoshop Elements is much easier to learn and much less expensive to buy.

Tuition: \$60. Textbook required, approximately \$30. Prerequisite: membership in RCC.

All classes will be taught by Certified Professional Photographer Frank Peele, who originated the Redlands Adult School photography program and taught those classes for 12 years. Classes will meet in the:

Configuring Images for Digital Projection

Color Space: sRGB

Image Size: no smaller than 1280 pixels on the long side

File Format: jpg or jpeg

File Size: less than 3.5 mb (3.500 kb)

Image Title: (example) Blue Sky (normal capitalization, spaces, punctuation)

File Name: bluesky (no capitalization, spaces, punctuation) SaveAs: bluesky in .jpg format; it will automatically become "bluesky.jpg"

Message from our Treasurer

I am using this opportunity to clarify the process of getting reimbursed for money spent on club business by members, to pay bills or to account for money collected. For well over two years, Redlands Camera Club has had a policy dealing with reimbursements or accounting for collected money. In prior years, there was often little-to-no accounting of who got paid or why; and no receipts were required. Also, limited info, often on scraps of paper or backs of envelopes, was provided. Deposits did not document from where the money came or who collected it. I have never been a bookkeeper, but even I could see this was not ideal.

The **Voucher/Reimbursement** and **Collected Money** forms are on the club web site. Both forms are quick, consistent, and easy to fill out. The person to be reimbursed fills out one form, the person collecting monies (dues, etc.) fills out the other. With these, anyone can look at the "books" and immediately know who was paid and why, or how much was reimbursed. The required sales receipts document cost or how much money was collected, from where and by whom. The Treasurer attaches both forms to each bill or deposit with that month's statement. No need to read through letters, scraps of paper, or notes trying to interpret each expense.

I think everyone will agree that when it comes to money, there should be an accurate accounting of all club money spent, why it was spent, who the money was paid to. Complete receipts should be attached for expenditures, along with accounting for all money the club collects from many sources during the year. These forms make it much easier and accurate for everyone involved.

Cropping to a specific size (Photoshop and Elements)

Want to crop an image to an exact size? Simply click on the Crop tool, then enter the desired dimensions in the appropriate boxes in the Options Bar.

(for example: 1280 pixels Wide, 780 pixels High or 6 inches Wide, 4 inches High, and 300 DPI) When you click and drag the crop border, you will automatically create the established size.
