#### THE VIEW FROM HERE

While exploring the web looking for photographic hints and tricks, I came across a great article on "Learning to See" by Michael Reichmann at <a href="http://www.luminous-landscape.com/essays/learning-to-see.shtml">http://www.luminous-landscape.com/essays/learning-to-see.shtml</a>. In this article he discusses how to see and how to develop your own vision. I enjoyed the article so much that I have extracted the most relevant parts of it below:

... start looking at photographs. ... spend some considerable time studying them. Not with the TV on in the background, but by yourself, quietly, and at some length. Look at each image, and ask yourself what it is that captures your eye. Is it the light, the subject, the composition, a combination of these, or something else?

... Visit an art museum and look at both contemporary as well as historical (art). What styles and periods do you like? Which artist's work excites you? ... when you look at how visual artists have recorded and interpreted their worlds over the centuries, you may derive some insights into your own way of seeing things, or even discover a new way of doing so.

... attend a field workshop (or take classes) ... whose purpose is to explore creativity and to provide critical feedback. Few people have an opportunity to have their work critiqued by someone with a discerning eye. "That's a nice shot..." just isn't the type of feedback that helps anyone learn and grow. The more critical the evaluation of your portfolio, the more valuable it will be to you.

... The best way to learn how to see, is to practice seeing (by shooting daily). ... Even if it's just a shot of your back yard furniture, or the dog next door, ask yourself why you shot it the way you did. Then tomorrow, try to see it differently and shoot it again.... No need to save these files. Just trash them after you've spent some time examining them. Don't even bother doing any post processing. ... The issue here is not technical perfection, or aspects of image quality. ... You want to divorce yourself from everything except the question of seeing, and recording what you see in a way that's meaningful to you....

Don't fear taking bad photographs .... Shoot freely. Explore the world around you. See how something that you saw and shot yesterday can be different today, in different light or weather. Or, maybe simply because of your mood. ... Then, when you do find yourself out taking photographs in a place where there is potential, you may just find that two things will happen. You will be more open to possibilities, and your fluidity with your equipment will be enhanced.

# Redlands Camera Club School of Photography Spring 2012 Semester Courses Announced

**Basic Photography** Tuesdays 6 to 9 p.m. for six weeks, beginning Feb. 21, 2012

This class is designed for those who are relatively new to digital photography, whether you have previous experience shooting film or not. The fundamentals of photography – choosing the best camera for your needs, the technical considerations, understanding light, the principles of composition, an introduction to managing and editing your work in the computer – and much more will be covered. Tuition: \$60. Prerequisite: membership in RCC (dues are \$25 per year, and include many added benefits).

<u>Intermediate Photography</u> Tuesdays 6 to 9 p.m. for seven weeks, beginning Apr. 3, 2012

The focus in this class is entirely on improving your creative and technical skills. The class will meet once a week at photogenic areas in the Redlands area for 3 hours of shooting, and once a week to critique students' photographs. The shooting sessions will be scheduled at the best day and evening times for photography; the shooting schedule will be established by mutual agreement of the class members at the first class meeting on April 3. The critiquing sessions will take place on Tuesday evenings, 6 to 9 p.m., in the classroom. To give each student personal attention in shooting and critiques, this class will be strictly limited to 15 students. Tuition: \$120. Pre-requisites: membership in RCC and Basic Photography or equivalent course work.

Adobe Photoshop Elements 10 Tuesdays 6 to 9 p.m. for six weeks, beginning May 22, 2012

Digital photography offers the potential for enhancements that equal anything that could ever have been done in the traditional wet darkroom – and so much more. Using Adobe Photoshop Elements 10 (available for PC and Mac), you'll learn how to manage your growing collection of digital files and how to realize your own personal vision through the amazing power of image editing. Packed with most of the power of its "bigger brother" Photoshop CS 5, Photoshop Elements 10 is much easier to learn and much less expensive to buy. Tuition: \$60. Your own copy of the software and the textbook are required. You will not need to bring a computer to the classroom. Prerequisite: membership in RCC. The textbook is *Adobe Photoshop Elements* 10 Classroom in a Book, published by Adobe Press.

Classes will be taught by Certified Professional Photographer Frank Peele. Classes will meet in the Education Building of the *Redlands First United Methodist Church*, 1 E. Olive Avenue

#### FIELD TRIPS

Our February field trip will be to Bolsa Chica, a trip we have done in the past, and has been very popular. The primary target is birds, and this one is timed for a fairly high tide, when the birds will be closer in and easier to photograph. Of course we never know what birds we will see, but there should be a variety of terns, gulls, ducks, and shorebirds, as well as some land birds. There are many wintering birds on the coast, so let's hope some of them come out to play with us!

The trip will be on Saturday, February 25<sup>th</sup>. The highest tide that day will be a little after 10:00 am. Since the parking lot fills up on weekends, we will meet at 8:30 am at the parking area just off Pacific Coast Highway, south of Warner Avenue. We will shoot as the tide comes in, and should have several hours of good photography. Parking is somewhat limited there, and it is a popular spot, so carpooling is appropriate.

We will be walking around the estuary area, so packing light, equipment-wise, is sensible. Your most useful lens for birds will be a good zoom lens, pulling them in as close as possible. Tripods are allowed, but shooting birds in flight, or while hiking around, may be easier hand-held.

Bolsa Chica is about 70 miles from Redlands, and will take about 1.5 hours. Carpoolers should meet at Coco's in Redlands at 6:45 am, to leave by 7:00 am.

Directions: From Redlands, start on I-10 west, taking the I-215 toward Riverside. Merge onto the 91 Freeway, drive about 32 miles; merge onto the 55 Freeway, (exit # 34); exit onto the 22 freeway toward Long Beach; exit at Valley View Street/I-405 south (exit #5), go .3 miles. Then turn left onto Valley View Street, go .5 miles; Valley View becomes Bolsa Chica Road, go 1.8 miles. Bolsa Chica Road becomes Bolsa Chica Street, go 2.0 miles; turn right onto Warner Avenue, and drive south to Pacific Coast Highway. Turn left onto PCH and go about 1 mile to the parking lot for the reserve, on the left side of PCH.

#### FLOWER SHOW

We have once again been invited to provide a photographic flower exhibit at the Redlands Horticultural Society's annual Flower Show and Garden Tour. The theme of this, the  $100^{th}$  annual show. This is the  $5^{th}$  year that we have been invited, and we have been praised mightily each year for the quality of the images we have provided.

We will continue to select the entries as we have in the past, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting in March, which happens to be the Annual Banquet. All entries must be at least 8x10, and do not need to be matted or framed at this point. Any member in good standing may enter up to 4 entries for consideration. Take-in for the entries will be on March 21, from 5:30 to 6:00 pm.

The entries will be displayed for review, and voting will be by the general membership, with 3 choices per member. Soon after the dinner, counting of the votes will be done, and those images receiving the highest numbers of votes will be selected for the show, and members will be notified.

The actual pictures for display at ESRI will need to be matted and framed, in a 16x20" frame or slightly larger. No smaller framed pieces will be accepted, as they will be displayed in a large room, and we want to make a beautiful display with great visual impact.

To the best of my knowledge at this point, take-in will be on Friday, April 13<sup>th</sup>, from 5-6 pm. Last year they made a last minute change, and we did take-in on Saturday morning instead. Be prepared for either possibility, with take-down on Sunday the 15<sup>th</sup>, from 5-6 pm.

So pull out your best flower images, or hurry and take some new ones, and get ready!
