Prez Sez

A Film Metaphor

November is upon us, so it must be time for the Thanksgiving feast and the inevitable Holiday season. I'm thankful this year for the opportunity to travel in October to my (and Frank's) favorite Puget Sound island, Whidbey. My wife and I got to visit family, and we also got to visit something else we hadn't seen much of in 6 months, rain. It rained every day, as is usual this time of year in the Northwest, and we loved every drop of it. Tall green and multicolored trees that were not palms or cell towers were a welcome sight.

On return I attended the monthly Inland Empire Professional Photographers and Videographers (IEPPV) meeting in Riverside to hear a presentation on travel photography by Dan Holmes. Dan (www.danholmesphoto.com) is a professional photographer who leads journeys all over the world and he provided some excellent advice on getting that special shot of that special place.

Dan likens a good photograph to a good movie. Every good one has a lead actor, a supporting cast, and a set, and Dan spent a lot of time talking about and showing how each of those elements is present in a good photograph.

I thought about that as it applies to our club. At first I thought as president I must be the lead actor, and I guess that's true as I lead the Pledge and make the announcements. But those announcements come from what might be called an ensemble cast, our board. They are the ones who come up with the ideas for programs, educational events, competitions, field trips, and so much more. The supporting cast is our membership, you who participate whether it's attending an event, or just being present for a meeting on our set. Of course when you provide input to the board members, you become part of the ensemble, not just the supporting cast. And I thank you and our board for your support.

Another thing Dan talked about was rules. We talk about rules of composition regularly in our workshops, members' nights, and competitions. And almost always when someone mentions the rule of thirds, we hear, "Well, it's not really a rule." Dan felt that way about rules for years, and used the TLAR principle (That Looks About Right) to compose his photos. Then he realized that what he felt were the best images were the ones that followed the "rules." He discovered that the rules are rules because they work.

So think about your composition as you work with your image both on site and in post. Don't follow the rules just because they are rules. Apply the ones that work and look right to you. And have fun!

Author of the book Miles of Wonder, featuring some 500 images from the Mohave Desert and environs, David Jesse McChesney is a master of finding and framing elusive, desert creatures such as bighorns, bobcats and quail. Drawing lessons from a newer, major portfolio, American Birdlife, he'll share locations, time of day tips, bird behavior insights and equipment basics for successful bird photography. A workshop leader and popular

lecturer -- who sometimes enhances presentations with original songs on his harmonica -- David is a resident of Joshua Tree and an instructor of advanced photography at the park's Desert Institute. Lightroom/Photoshop Workflow

On successful completion of this course you should be able to:

Retrieve and organize your photos:

- Getting images from your camera/ memory card into Lightroom.
- Getting photos already on your computer into Lightroom.
- Edit in Lightroom to correct color, exposure, cropping then go to Photoshop to perform other retouching and special effects.

Class will start Tuesday Jan. 10, 2017 and will meet for 6 weeks ending Feb. 14, 2017. We will meet at our regular meeting place at the First Presbyterian Church at 6:30 pm until 8:30 pm (2 hrs).




RCC Photo Blog

ADOBE PHOTOSHOP LIGHTROOM CC 2015.7 UPDATE

The following describes the new important features added to Lightroom with the release of CC 2015.7.


Syncing photos to the Creative Cloud:


In this update to Lightroom (CC 2015.7), you can now drag images directly to the **All Synced Photographs** collection in the Catalog panel. By doing so, the image syncs with the Creative Cloud, and ensures that you'll be able to edit, organize, or share the photo on the go with Lightroom across your devices.



Publish to Adobe Stock Contributor Site

- You can now submit images directly from Lightroom CC to the brand new Adobe Stock Contributor Site using the included Adobe Stock Publish Service. By contributing to Adobe Stock, you have the opportunity to showcase your work to millions of customers directly inside Creative Cloud applications.
- It's simple to become an Adobe Stock contributor. If you have great photos, videos or vector content and you own all the rights, you can become an Adobe Stock contributor. You must also be at least 18 years of age and the sole owner of every file you upload for sale.
- You can sell photographs, videos, vectors, and illustrations on Adobe Stock. You can submit
 quality content in all subject areas, including images with models, culture diversity, technology,
 fashion, food, portraiture, lifestyle, architecture, beauty, business, and more. Every time
 someone purchases your content on Adobe Stock, and get a 33% commission for photos and
 vector art, and a 35% commission for videos based on the price of the image.
- You should be aware of any logos and trademarks that appear in your images, vectors or videos
 are strictly forbidden and must be removed before submission. If your content contains
 recognizable persons, buildings, locations, or intellectual property such as objects, artwork,
 sculptures, or designs, a signed Model or Property release must be attached.
- To setup an account do the following:
 - Click on Publish Services panel in the Library module and then click on the word Set Up in the Adobe Stock pane.
 - This will bring up the Lightroom Publishing Manager dialog box shown below. Begin by establishing an account (item one in the list)





 IMPORTANT: After you set up your account be sure to depress the Save button at the bottom of the above dialog box.

• Uploading images to Adobe Stock:

- Once you set up your account, there is nothing else you need to do within Lightroom. As you should be signed in to your Adobe account using Lightroom already, the Publish Service now is ready to upload. To upload images, just drag them from existing folders into the Publish Service, or right-click the Submit collection within the Adobe Stock publish service to make it your target collection. Images can be added to one target collection at a time from anywhere in the Library module by depressing the 'B' key.
- When you are ready for uploading, all it takes is selecting your image and right clicking on the Submit to Adobe St... line (indicated by red arrow in the figure below). Then choose the "Publish Now" option. Your image(s) will be uploaded to Adobe Stock in the background.



To verify your image(s) were uploaded, right click on the Submit to Adobe St... line (indicated by red arrow in the figure above). Then choose the "View Adobe Stock" option.


Develop Performance Improvements using Smart Previews:

Since Lightroom 5's release, we have used Smart Previews to speed up the Develop module. At 2560px, they're smaller than most raw files and partially processed, so the Develop module loading times and interactive performance was improved. Normally you used Smart Previews when the original photo was taken offline.

To increase Lightroom's performance while editing your photos in the Develop module, you now set a new preference option. Choose Edit>Preferences>Performance Tat and check the **Use Smart Previews instead of Originals for image editing** checkbox under the Develop section to automatically utilize any Smart Previews which have been built in advance. You should find that high-resolution photos that previously caused your computer to struggle can now be edited much more smoothly, as though it were a smaller photo. Before this update, performance was faster in the Develop Module when using Smart Previews when the original images were disconnected from the computer.

Also when you zoom in to 1:1 view, Lightroom automatically loads the original file to provide the

most accurate preview for judging noise reduction and sharpening.

EF 17-40 mm f/4 L superwide zoom lens, complete with lens hood, front and rear caps, lens case, instructions and original box. Buy it and a free 77 mm Canon UV filter comes with it. Like all newer "L" series lenses, it is well-sealed against dust and moisture and has fast, silent autofocus with anytime manual focus. Front of lens does not rotate, facilitating use of polarizing filters. Overall lens length does not change with zoom or focus adjustments.

In like-new condition, this lens creates ultra-sharp images on full- and crop-frame Canon DSLRs. This has been my go-to lens for landscape and architecture shooting, and I've always been very happy with the images created with it. I baby my gear, and this lens shows it.

Lens sells for \$799 new; KEH lists a used one in equivalent condition (but without UV filter, original

box or manual) for \$619 + shipping.
