
Puppy and Kitty Portraits Help Shelter Pets Find New Homes





Time to Get Our Flowers On!

RCC has again been invited to show our flower or garden photography in conjunction with Redlands Horticultural Society's annual Garden Tour. As last year, we will have our display space in the Museum of Redlands building (the old Daily Facts building) at 700 Brookside Avenue.

The Garden Tour will be held on Saturday and Sunday, April 27&28th, from 10 am to 4 pm. Our framed prints will be brought in on that Saturday morning for

hanging, with pick-up on Sunday at the end of the Garden Tour. The exact times will be announced closer to the time.


We have been informed that we will have a good-sized space for our display, so we expect to be able to hang a good number. For this reason we will not be jurying the images, but we will ask for notification of who plans to bring prints. Depending on the response we have, we will be able to bring in 2 or 3 images per person. Stay tuned for more information!

However, no matter the number, we will need to prepare them for hanging in the show, framed to at least 16x20 inches, matted and framed, with wire on the back for hanging. Images printed on metal or canvas do not need to be framed, but should have wire for hanging. We will need to have volunteers to stay with the show and to answer questions regarding RCC. These will be in 2 hour shifts, 10 to 12, 12 to 2, 2 to 4, for both days.

I currently work periodically as a reporter and photographer for the Yucaipa News Mirror. Last year, I had the opportunity to travel with



Here's What I Think! ~By John Williams~

Using your Smart Phone for taking photos: The mobile phone gives you the convenience to grab your phone out of the pocket and take a picture when you don't have time to setup your DSLR or it's your only camera. Listed below are mobile phone apps to edit and determine the sunset/sunrise times.


- 1. Adobe Photoshop Lightroom CC (sometimes referred to as Lightroom Mobile):
 - Lightroom CC for mobile and tablets is a free app that gives you the ability to capture (Raw images), edit and share your photos.
 - You can sync your photos between your mobile phone, Adobe Cloud and Desktop/Laptop computer if you have an active *Adobe Creative Cloud* subscription (photographer's plan –\$9.99/mo.).
 - System requirements:
 - **iOS:** Lightroom for mobile supports any iPhone or iPad that runs iOS 11 or later. This includes: iPhone 5S (2013) and later, iPad Mini 2 (2013) and later, iPad Air 1 (2013) and later, and iPod Touch 6th Generation (2015).
 - **Android:** Lightroom for mobile supports phones running Android 5.x (Lollipop) and later.
 - Install Lightroom CC on your desktop/laptop to manage, edit, share and delete images from the Cloud (up to 20 GB of storage under the Photographer's Plan). If you click the Cloud Icon at the very top of the workspace, you can determine how much of the 20 GB storage you are using. To delete a photo from Adobe Cloud, select a photo(s) and right-click. In the popup menu depress *Delete Photo*.
- **2. 1 Weather:** This app provides you with all the weather forecast for the day. The app reports weather forecasts from 3 million locations worldwide at a three hourly interval basis. 1Weather is a free app.

3. Sunrise & sunset times for the Sun and Moon:

The Photographer's Ephemeris (TPE):

- This app helps you plan outdoor photography in natural light. You can see how the light will fall on the land, day or night, for any location on earth.
- After finding and plotting a location, the app instantly reveals the sunrise and sunset times, but also reveals the direction of the light on the map using colored lines. A *yellow line* indicates the angle of sunrise, while sunsets are revealed in *orange*. Light blue line indicates the Moon rise location and the dark grey line indicates the moon setting location. Helpfully, the app displays the current direction of light as well revealed on the map by a thin orange line.
- There is also an iOS and Android mobile app for a nominal fee (\$2.99) that has the same functionality.
- Photo Time:
 - o This app shows when the sunrise and sunset times occur for the location selected.
 - Additionally the app gives you the golden and blue hour times with precision up to one minute.

• You can customize both location and time.

4. Depth-of-Field (DOF) calculators:


HyperFocal Pro:

- This tool will help you obtain perfect focus & zone of sharpness and keep the guesswork out when focusing/framing.
- This tool gives you your DOF and HFD based on your camera and lens data. It chooses the circle of confusion automatically based on the camera sensor.
- You can easily configure your shooting parameters and view all the relevant focus information. It includes a graphical representation of the shooting scene, for a quick & intuitive view of the information. Additionally, you can obtain Angle of View and Field of View values for accurate composition and preparing your photography gear for specific scenarios.
- DOF Calculator:
 - o This app calculates Hyperfocal Distance, Near Focus Limit, Far Focus limit, and Depth of Field (DOF).
 - \circ $\;$ Has option to select teleconverters, automatically corrects focal length and apertures

- Cloud information at various levels shown as % of the sky obscured. The deeper the blue, the clearer the skies. A white box indicates complete cloud coverage.
- Basic moon rise/set times and phase information are provided for the forecast location. If you hover over this area you can see the meridian details time, altitude and distance.
- If the satellite icon is visible, you can tell at a glance that there is going to be an ISS pass over at the forecast location during that hour.

5. Star Walk 2:

- Star Walk 2 is one of the most aesthetically pleasing astronomy apps out there. The app opens with a beautiful live view of the sky, reflecting your current location. The live view also has nice calming background music.
- You can tap objects you see in the live sky to get a concise description, as well as a detailed image of the object. The search feature is also great, and the voice search works perfectly. The best feature of Star Walk 2 however, is the time slider that lets you slide through time and see how the objects move.
- App is free. \$4.99 to remove ads.

6. Light Pollution Map:

- Light Pollution Map allows you to easily locate dark sites where the sky will not be affected by light pollution, allowing the best observance, star gazing, and photography of the night sky.
- With an integrated cloud cover map and temperature indicator, always know before you even step outside if it's worth going outside to see the night sky.
- ISS Tracker: Follow the international space station on a live map, see when it's flying above your location, who is currently on the ISS, and view a live ISS webcam.
