We will announce the winners from our Summer Competition. In addition, Bob Fletcher will show us the HOW TO, the WHERE TO and the TIME TO photograph the 2024 Solar Eclipse

The next total solar eclipse to visit North America will be April 8, 2024. The duration of totality will be up to 4 minutes and 27 seconds, almost double that of The Great American Eclipse of August 21, 2017. The 2017 total solar eclipse was witnessed by about 20 million people from Oregon to South Carolina, and the upcoming 2024 Great American Eclipse is sure to be witnessed by many millions more.

After the total solar eclipse on April 8, 2024, the next total solar eclipse that can be seen from the contiguous United States will be on August 23, 2044!!!

If you've never seen a total solar eclipse before, put it on your bucket list and mark the date. It is truly a breath-taking sight. You won't regret traveling to see the Sun's corona, while you stand in the shadow of the moon!





Competition Summer 2023

The Summer 2023 Competition went well, with 35 entries. There were a few glitches that kept some images out, but those members are aware of what happened, and we are working on processes to avoid losing entries. Unfortunately, we had one entry that had a very small identification of the maker, and it was noticed by one of the judges. Our rules do not allow any

identifying features, so the image was disqualified. The discovery wasn't made until after scores and comments had been made, so the member was able to get a good critique but was ineligible for any ribbons.

A couple of other images didn't make it in because there were some technical issues, and there was insufficient time to resolve the problem before the entry form was taken down on the last day. There was also at least one member who forgot when the closing date and time were. We are working as I said to resolve our processes to avoid leaving anyone out. But we need

We are working as I said to resolve our processes to avoid leaving anyone out. But we need your help also. Competitions open on the evening of the first club meeting (live) of the month and will close on the Wednesday following the second (Zoom) meeting of the month. That gives us barely enough time to assemble the images for judging the following Monday in a private Zoom session. (We're working on that.) It would help a lot of you could get your entries in as early as possible, so if there any technical problems we can resolve them before closing. After judging, scores are compiled, ribbons assigned, and labels printed in time for the next live club meeting. We're looking forward to seeing you at our awards presentation at the church on August 7.

There will be no Fall 2023 competition. Our winter competition will accept entries from 11 PM on October 16 through 11 PM on November 18. The recorded judging will be shown at our November Zoom program on the 20th. Awards will be presented at our live meeting on December 4.

Thanks again to everyone who entered and helped with the scoring for the Summer 2023 Competition.

I am self taught, but I try to attend classes, events and workshops as often as I can to learn new skills and techniques. I am looking forward to being involved with the club and improving my photography.










Intro to Photography 6-Week Class

Purpose of the Course

Photographic "seeing" is different from ordinary everyday "seeing". We use our eyes continuously for many things, but we also have our brain to help us both understand and interpret what we are viewing. A camera has no such ability; in fact, it is nothing more than a simple recording device. It is easy to take a picture – that requires nothing more than pushing the shutter button. However, taking a photograph is something

else entirely. Mastering the making of a photograph can be a lifelong adventure and this course is designed to help individuals begin that journey.

Course Description

This is an introductory course in the theory and practice of basic techniques for capturing digital images with artistic merit. This course introduces the technical process of digital photography, including camera operation and the essential techniques of images capture.

Students are encouraged to bring a digital or film camera (which has manual controls) as well as the manual (if you have one). Questions regarding your specific camera can be most effectively answered with your camera and manual for reference.

Cource Objectives

The lectures will introduce and explain photographic concepts and techniques for capturing images. We will be covering but not limited to: Exposure, Aperture, Shutter Speed, ISO, Creative use of exposure controls, In camera light meter – Histogram, Exposure Bracketing,

Camera Handling, Basic Composition


