Photographing Urban Scenes ... Buildings and People


Monday, September 18 @ 7pm Zoom Meeting – Rick Hulbert



Upcoming Winter Image Competition Category X "Cell Phone"

When I joined the Redlands Camera Club 15 years ago, I signed up for a Photography class offered by the Redlands Unified School District Adult Education department. Those classes are long gone, but the instructors at that time were provided by our club. My favorite instructor was Frank

Peele who taught me that the best camera for the job is the one you have with you. That camera is not often my DSLR mirrorless, but rather it's my humble cell phone.

Cell phones have their limitations, mainly because of their very small image sensors, but technological progress has allowed them to output some very good images for display in smaller formats such as computer screens.

Are they good enough for competition?

We'll find out in our Winter Competition, when Category X will be "Cell Phone."

Standard rules for competition images will apply: JPG format, sRGB color space, maximum 4,000 pixels on the long side, maximum of 200 dpi. The image size should not exceed 3.5 MB.

The image must have been made on a device designed for use as a cell phone but has a camera as a feature. The use of image processing software such as Lightroom, Photoshop, or others is allowed and encouraged.

Remember that the best shots are the ones that you compose, light, and expose well when you shoot them. That way, processing should only make the image better.

Entries will be accepted starting on October 16, with awards distributed on December 4.




Intro to Photography 6-Week Class



Members \$75 / Non Members \$100 6 week class starting September 11, taught by Dave Ficke

Purpose of the Course

Photographic "seeing" is different from ordinary everyday "seeing". We use our eyes continuously for many things, but we also have our brain to help us both understand and interpret what we are viewing. A camera has no such ability; in fact, it is nothing more than a simple recording device. It is easy to take a picture – that requires nothing more than pushing the shutter button. However, taking a photograph is something

else entirely. Mastering the making of a photograph can be a lifelong adventure and this course is designed to help individuals begin that journey.

Course Description

This is an introductory course in the theory and practice of basic techniques for capturing digital images with artistic merit. This course introduces the technical process of digital photography, including camera operation and the essential techniques of images capture.

Students are encouraged to bring a digital or film camera (which has manual controls) as well as the manual (if you have one). Questions regarding your specific camera can be most effectively answered with your camera and manual for reference.

Cource Objectives

The lectures will introduce and explain photographic concepts and techniques for capturing images. We will be covering but not limited to: Exposure, Aperture, Shutter Speed, ISO, Creative use of exposure controls, In camera light meter – Histogram, Exposure Bracketing, Camera Handling, Basic Composition

Communication with the instructor will be a priority to help the students to become successful.
