

The Beauty Below – Underwater Photography Monday, May 6 @ 7pm

Since about 70 percent of the earth's surface is covered in water, the underwater environment offers unique photo opportunities. The environment can be colorful, majestic, threatening, and/or inspiring. This fascinating presentation will be given by members of the Redlands Underwater Photography Club.

As experienced divers with cumbersome photo equipment that resists damage from water and pressure, our presenters have travelled the world to enjoy and photograph reefs, kelp beds, shipwrecks, and more. They will share some of their photos and a few strategies based on the physics of diving and the camera and strobe settings required.






High-Key/Low Key Photography Monday, May 20 @ 7pm – Zoom Meeting

Zoom Meeting – Greg Holden

High-Key/Low Key photos add impact to your image by creating a strong contrast between lights and darks. Typically, high-key photos have large amounts of pure white with no shadows, while low-key is the opposite with lots of dark space occupying your frame. Great photos of this type are achieved intentionally through camera settings during image capture, although you can further emphasize the effect in post-processing. This is one of the times where "breaking the rules" and blowing out highlights or clipping shadows is expected!

Greg will provide some examples of both B&W and color images utilizing this technique and explain what camera settings he used. While this presentation will focus on high-key photos, Greg will also show some examples of low-key photos to emphasize the difference.

COMPETITION UPDATE

Once again, thanks to everyone who participated in the Spring Competition. Our next competition will be our Summer 2024 Digital competition, currently planned for our June 17 Zoom meeting. Entry dates will be from 11 PM, May 20 – 11 PM June 5.

A preliminary announcement of category X for the Summer Competition resulted from a suggestion on our survey. "Photographs of teeny tiny things" seemed like a good idea until I realized that we already had such a regular category in "close-up." So, a further look at the survey results brought forth "Use of Light." That's what photography is all about, but light at special times is particularly challenging. Here's your challenge for the Summer Competition: Twilight. Dawn, dusk, golden hour, call it what you like, try to capture the unique lighting from the beginning or ending of the day.

We are exploring a new platform for our competitions, hosted by printcomp.com, that hosts competitions for many organizations including Professional Photographers of America and IEPPV. Entry size requirements and categories will remain the same, but users will need to pay a modest annual fee to them as well as our usual per-entry fee. It will allow us to present High-definition images to our judges rather than Zoom images (which can be of reduced quality), and will take care of a lot of the administrative load. We hope to implement the platform for the Winter 2024 Competition in November, so we plan to continue to use the old system for the Summer competition. More to come.

I grew up with a father who was always willing to tear into something unfamiliar. "See that guy there?" he'd say, pointing to an auto mechanic. "Are you as smart as that guy?" "How do you think he learned how to do what he does?" And so, without any previous experience, we completely rebuilt the engine of his 1965 Mustang.

Few of us photographers can afford private lessons from a professional. But all of us at Redlands Camera Club have some great resources for getting smarter at our craft. The club has sponsored classes for beginners to learn the basics of their gear and to grow their understanding and experience with various subject matter. There are field trips for practicing what we hear from our program speakers.

And what about RCC's YouTube channel? If you haven't checked it out, you should. Are you thinking about doing some time-lapse photography? On the RCC YouTube channel, you'll find a recorded presentation on that very topic. In fact, you'll find recordings for many programs over the past several years. On YouTube, search for Redlands Camera Club. Click the RCC logo to go to the "channel." Once there, click "Playlists" then "Meetings." Want to learn how to do better bird photography? Check out Debra Dorothy's "10 Tips to Better Bird Photography" and others.

So, I went to YouTube and typed in the error code I was seeing on my dishwasher. Up comes several videos, one of which is for my model of machine. I followed the steps and, guess what, I successfully fixed the problem and am now less intimidated by all those buttons and tech.




