

 format try to keep your image size around 1080×1920.



I always learn so much from the judges' feedback, and I hope you found valuable takeaways as well. Their insights motivate me to keep sharpening my skills.



Spring Wildflower Workshop

Taught by Dave Ficke | Cost \$100/person | Max 6, min 3 students

Spring work is going on with joyful enthusiasm ~John Muir.

As winter fades and warmer days return, wildflowers begin their yearly rebirth. In Southern California, climate shifts make the season unpredictable. Some years bring only a light bloom, while others offer a

real show. Rain and temperature decide everything. Too little rain means a weak bloom, steady rain helps, and a sudden heat wave can dry the flowers almost overnight.

We will be covering safety, camera settings macro – telephoto lenses, tripods, clothing, lighting and how to take wildflower images.

February 9th – first Zoom meeting – students will learn about lenses and camera settings and what they will need for being in the field. Students will be given a few weeks to get some of the items they will need for field work. Students will have two weeks to practice around their home and submit images for discussion on 2nd zoom meeting.

February 23rd Second zoom – this is designed for students to share some of their images, share what went well or not so well.

February 28th first field meeting – Southern entrance to Joshua Tree National Park.

Late March (date TBD) – Dogwood flower shoot in the San Bernardino Mountains and other possibilities of mountain wildflowers – date to be determined based on weather.





Save It For A Rainy Day Russell Trozera

Winter is settling in, and we have had our share of rainy days. Bad weather makes it hard to get outside with a camera, so this season is a great time to bring your photography indoors. Macro work and table top setups can turn an ordinary day at home into a creative adventure.

Portrait lighting can be simple. A window, a lamp, or one small flash is often enough. The same is true for macro photography. You do not need fancy gear. A single light, a reflector, or even a piece of white paper can shape the scene.

Flowers are always a good place to start. Bring a few home, set them near a window, and let the colors glow. One of my favorite winter projects came from an orchid my wife grew. I remembered a photo Dave Garner made of his grandchild in a field of flowers with a bold border and a playful pop out effect. That inspired me to take the orchid, place it behind a mat, and create a simple, clean composition that felt fresh and fun.

Cold weather also gives you time to organize your photos or learn a new technique. Macro work is perfect for slow days. Look around your home, set up a small space, and let your creativity grow.

Most of all, enjoy the process.


